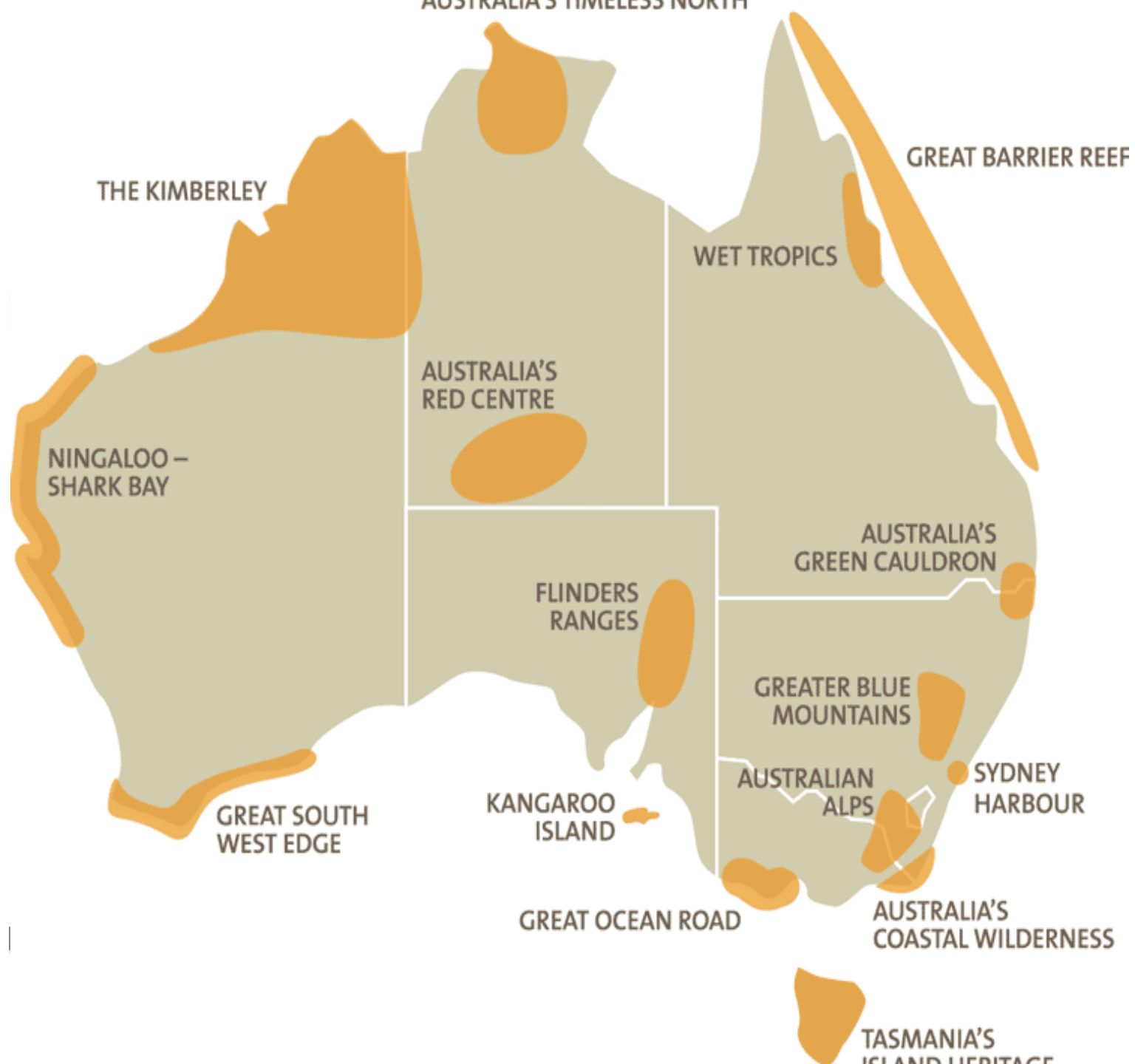

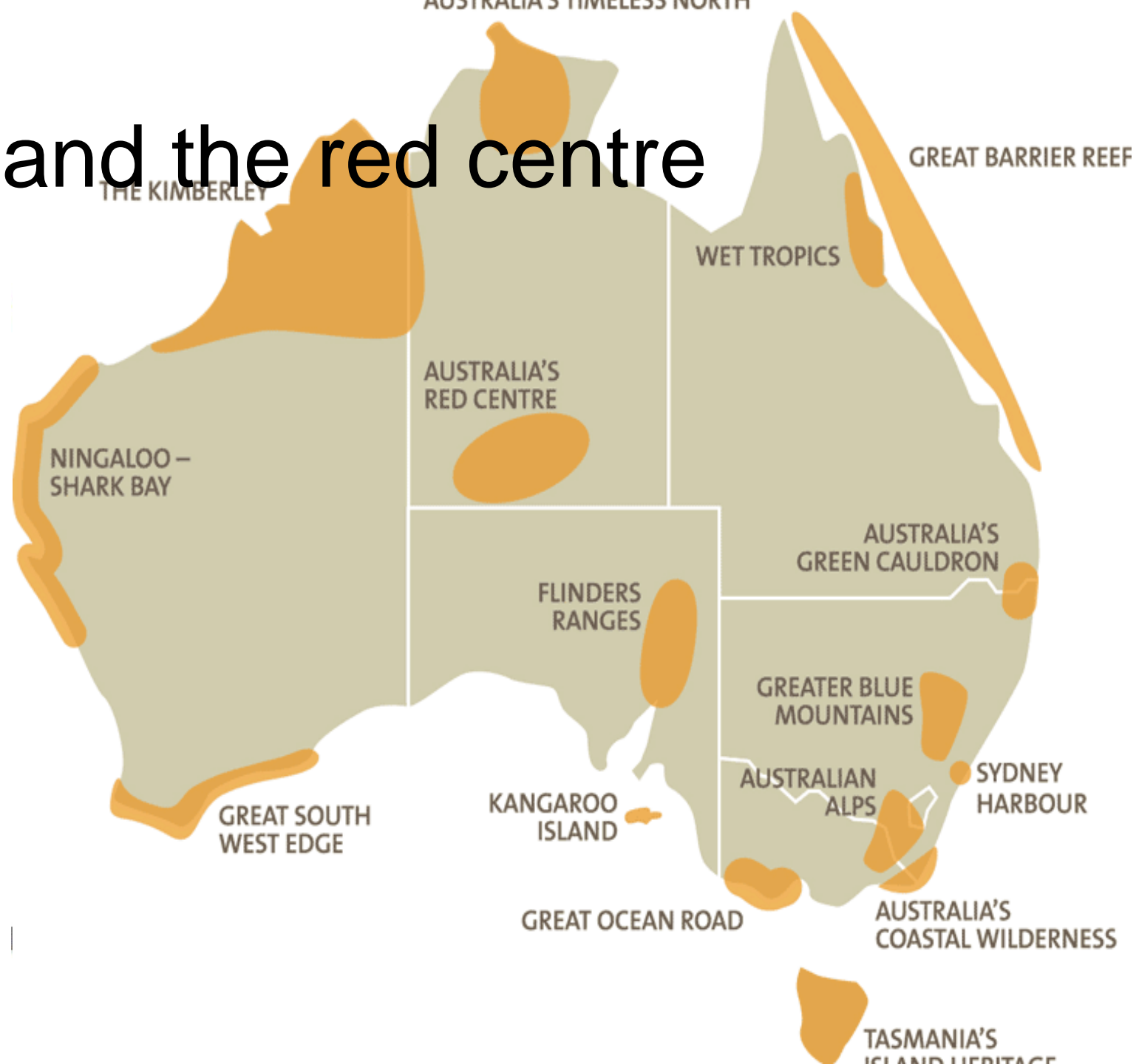
Rectangular Ship

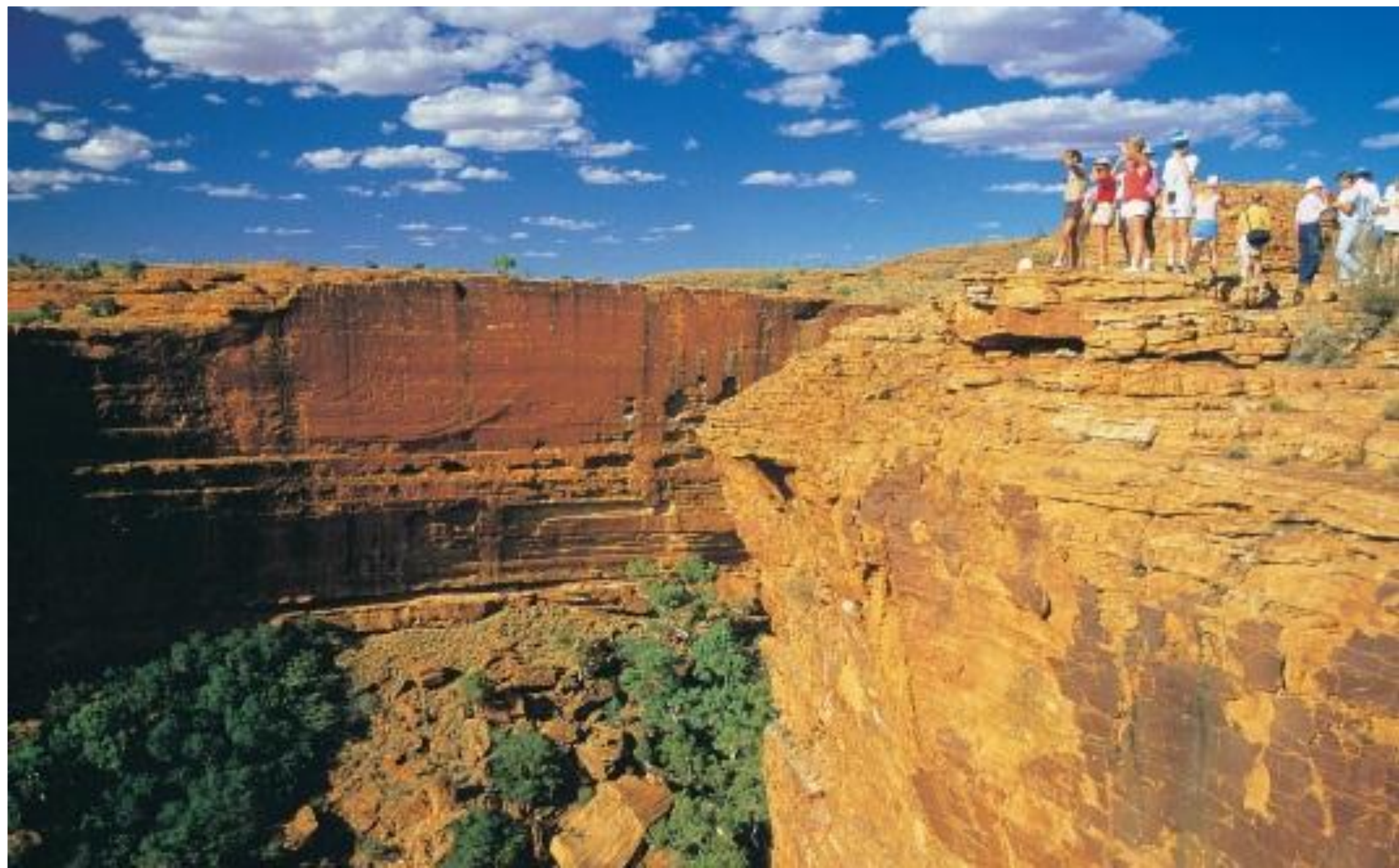

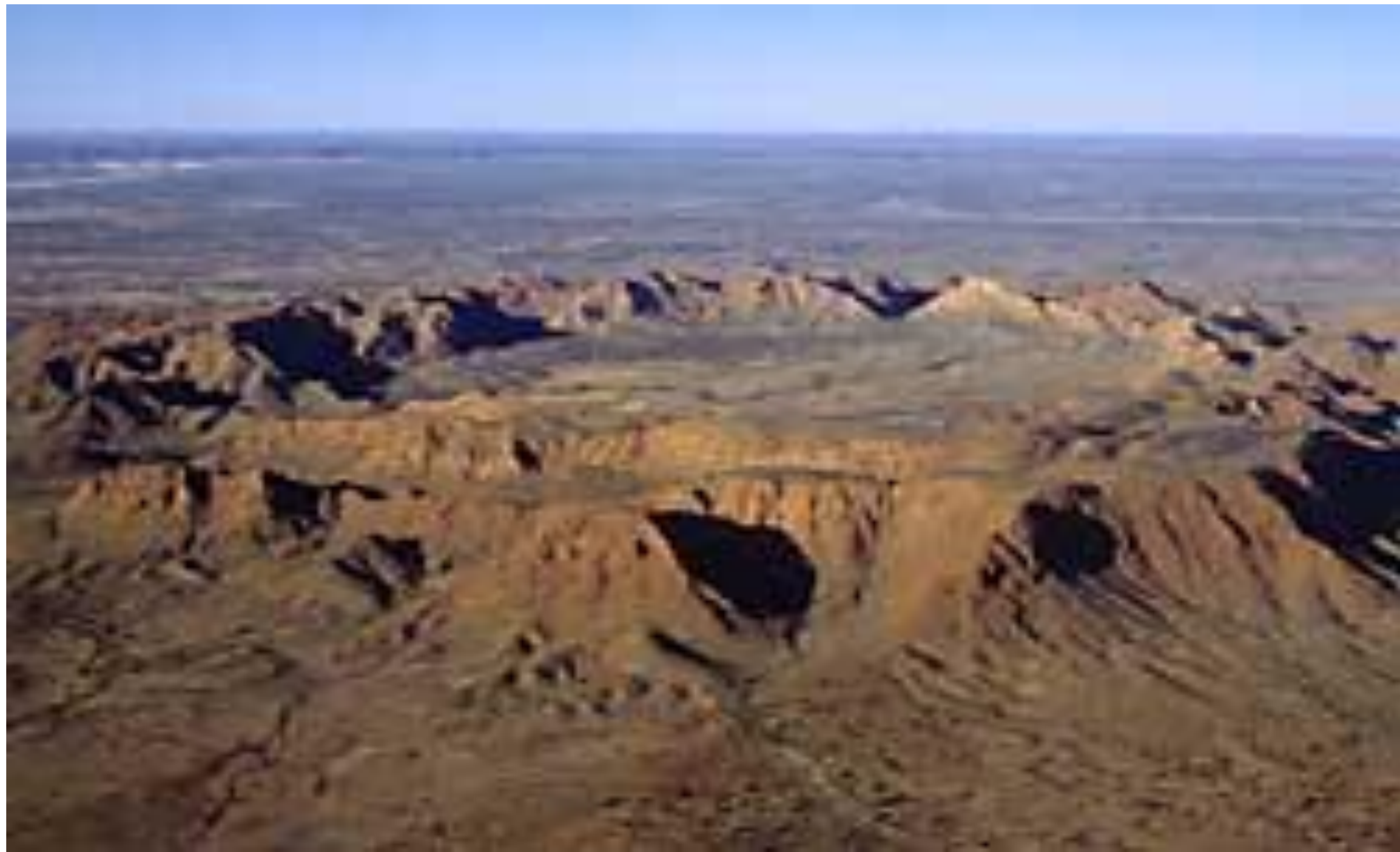




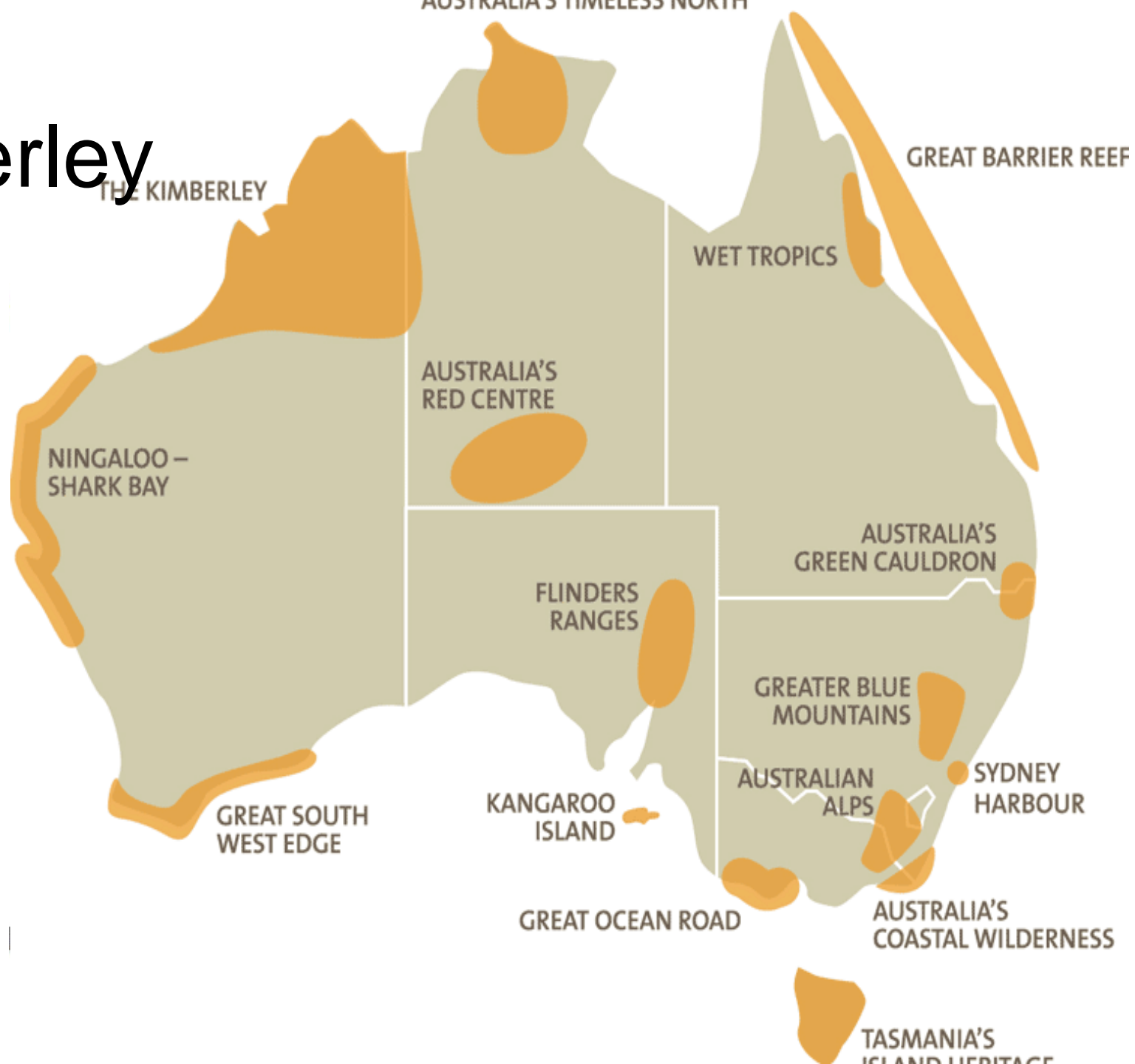

Bungle Bungle

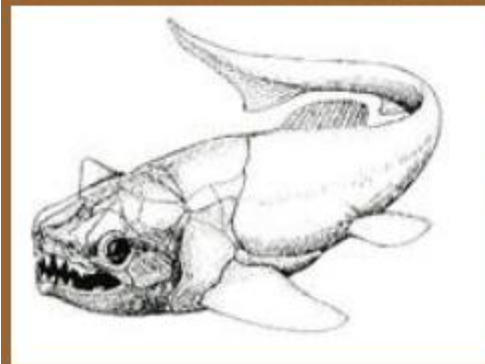
- Geological significance: None

- Age: Devonian
- Paragenesis: sediments with various amount of clay and different moisture content blue green alga again protect surface of the rock
- Significance: Mythical
- Mineralisation None

- Host rock: Limestone
- Age: Devonian
- Paragenesis: Coral reefs growing on basement in shallow >150m water.
- Significance: Mythical, fabulous fossils, and cast topography
- Mineralisation Pb Zn
